#### Overview

This course has two complementary foci: first, to allow students to reflect on their undergraduate experience, particularly in terms of content and skills developed. Second, the course will help students marshal that experience as they embark on the process of developing a career. The course meets twice a week. In the classroom, the focus will be on reviewing and understanding the required readings, and on engaging with the varied guests who will visit the class. Outside the classroom, the course asks students to explore the career resources in and around Ohio State. Built into the course throughout are multiple moments to think about research and writing as life-long skills.

#### **Course Format**

This seminar meets twice a week. Success in the course is based on engaging with the required readings. This means submitting thoughtful responses to the day's readings at least **one hour** prior to each class, and showing up in class to discuss. As in most seminars, the instructor is facilitator more than lecturer, and students are expected to come to class with the readings *read*, thought about, and in-hand, and ready to contribute to class discussion. Students are also expected to take advantage of guests to the class by being attentive and participating during their visits.

#### Readings

Readings are available on the course website in CARMEN. Students are expected to print out the readings, and bring the relevant ones **to class**. Students who anticipate problems printing out materials (lack of access to a printer, etc.) should bring this to the instructor's attention a week in advance.

# The course text is:

Solem, M., K. Foote, and J. Monk, 2013. *Practicing Geography (The Pearson AAG Series in Geography)*. Washington DC: Association of American Geographers and Pearson.

Prices vary depending on whether you buy an e-textbook (rent from \$18.85), a new paperback (\$23-\$44.79), or a used copy (from \$23).

Opportunity for reading comments close one hour prior to the beginning of class, and Dropboxes close at 5 pm on the day an assignment is due. ## Comments on Readings (30%)

Readings are assigned for most classes; they include a mix of academic and non-academic articles, blogs, and other materials. At least **ONE HOUR** prior to class (i.e., by 10:10 on T Th), please record your thoughts on the reading(s) in the appropriate Discussion section in Carmen: either as a stand-alone comment or a respectful response to someone else's comment. It will not be possible to post comments on a reading after the deadline. Thoughtful responses to the readings, demonstrating that you have engaged with the material, are worth 30% of your grade.

#### On- and off-campus Career Resource Exploration (Total: 15%)

OSU and Columbus offer innumerable resources for exploring careers in every conceivable sector of the labor market. Several assignments are designed to take advantage of these resources, and lay the foundation for career planning whether you plan to stay in Central Ohio after graduation or not.

- 1. By Sept 30, you will have had an appointment **EITHER** with
  - a. A Career Connection/OSL Career Counseling & Support Services councilor at the Younkin Success Center for a Career Assessment **OR**
  - b. An ASC Career Services advisor in their new offices in Denney Hall

Which you choose will depend on you. Regardless, 5% of your grade is based on evidence of this meeting.

- 2. Networking is essential no matter your post-graduate plans. 5% of your grade is based on you setting up (or updating/maintaining) both a OSU-based Future Link account and a LinkedIn account. For the latter, please 'Link' to my account. Due Oct. 21.
- 3. Autumn is a busy time for career planning, and there are several Career Fairs and Expos on campus (most are noted in the syllabus, but see also <a href="here">here</a>). Please attend at least one of those indicated and report to the class on your experience (5%); due in class within a week of event.

# Informational Interview (20%)

We will 'interviewing' various guests during class time. Through your networks and in discussion with the Instructor, you will also identify a senior person in a field that you are interested in somewhere in Central Ohio, and set up a face-to-face meeting with that person. You will record and transcribe the interview (or take detailed notes during or after) and write up your experience in a maximum of 5 pages. Due by Nov. 25, in Carmen. You will report on your experience to the class on Dec 4 and 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Take-home Exam (20%; due Dec. 15)

This exam will be an opportunity for you to reflect on, and consolidate, what you've learned in the class and how to make it work for you as you move towards graduation.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Students keen to do a research proposal can substitute for a take-home exam with permission and guidelines from the instructor. The instructor <u>must</u> be informed of this plan by Oct. 15 **at the latest**.
