

## **Assistant Professor (Teaching/Instructional) in Geographic Information Science**

The initial appointment will be for one year, including summer, renewable annually, pending continued college-level funding and satisfactory performance. The position is intended to support the Department's new Master's in Geographic Information Systems (GIS) program. The position is teaching intensive.

We seek a faculty member committed to graduate level GIS education who will be able to teach a combination of introductory, advanced, and applied courses focusing on GIS and related technologies and methods. The successful candidate will be able to teach some combination of the following courses: Spatial Database Design, GIS Application Development, Web and Mobile GIS, and Spatial Analysis. Some combination of skills in GIS database management, GIS programming, or spatial statistics is required. A Ph.D. in Geography or a related field is preferred by the start of employment; However, we will also consider applicants with a Masters degree and at least three years of experience in the GIS industry.
