

The Geographic Information Science Center (GISC) at the University of Michigan-Flint is seeking a full-time postdoctoral GIS Researcher with strong backgrounds in GIS web development, community health, and spatial analysis. The position is initially for one year (32 hours per week @30.00/hour) with continued employment contingent on obtaining additional funding and job performance.

The position will concentrate on the development of a Web GIS system that will serve UM-Flint and the greater Flint community. The work will include data collection, relational database management, server programming, online mapping, statistical analysis, spatial modeling, public speaking, and working directly with community members. There will also be an opportunity for teaching at least one GIS course per semester in the Department of Earth and Resource Science. Research publications and presentations of project results in professional journals and to the scientific community will be encouraged.

Applicants are required to apply online at <http://umjobs.org/> and should include (uploaded as one document) 1) a copy of their CV, 2) a 1-2 page cover letter that: a) explains their interest in the position, and b) outlines their relevant skills and experience, 3) a recent publication or dissertation chapter, and 4) the names and contact details (email addresses and telephone numbers) for three references in the CV or resume.
